

Our Earth's water cycle has been continuously recycling our water supply for more than four billion years.

The process begins with the heat from the sun causing water to turn into steam which evaporates into the sky. Condensation then occurs when the steam cools and returns to a liquid. When the liquid becomes too heavy for the clouds to hold, precipitation occurs, with the water returning to the Earth's surface in the form of rain, hail or snow.
